Momentum Campus Ministries



In April we had our first real, full blown, zero social distanced, year-end banquet since before covid. It felt so good not giving anyone personal space and celebrating an amazing ministry year up close and personal. In preparation for the event, I asked the people who signed up this question - how would you describe the culture of Geneva House/Momentum Campus Ministries in one word? 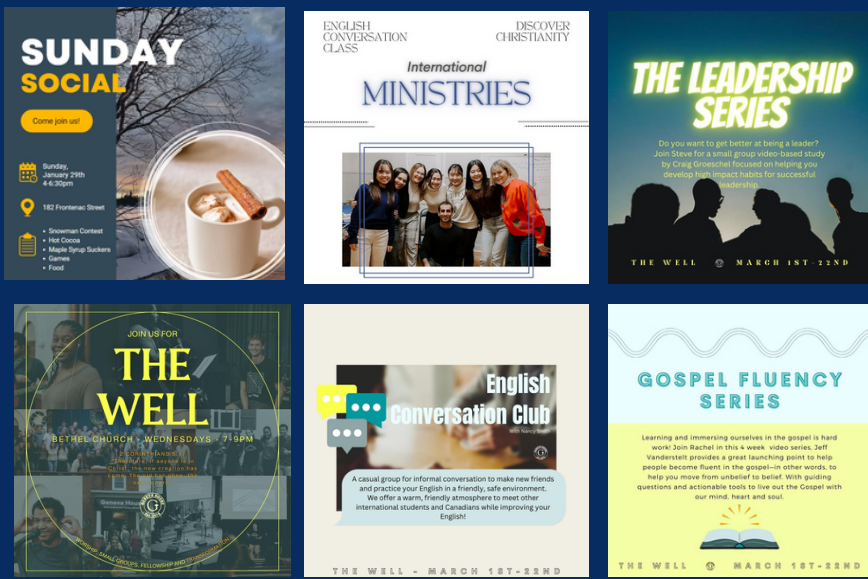

Huddles

Huddles are a big part of how we work to fulfill our mission on campus. Huddles are discipleship groups of 4-6 people who are learning to follow Jesus, to listen to the Spirit, and to live out God's mission in their everyday lives. We see so much transformation through huddles and it is always so exciting to see young adults becoming passionate followers of Jesus.

The Well

The Well is our Kingston young adult worship and small group gathering every Wednesday night during the semester at Bethel Church. Our small groups are designed to reach both Christian and non-Christians and this semester they included: The Prayer Course, Love Dates and Heartbreaks, Gospel Fluency, The Habits of Leaders, Crucial Conversations, and our international ministry's English Conversation Club ,

Beyond the Veil

Beyond the Veil is a Quinte area young adult worship night held once a month during the school year. It is an amazing partnership of campus and local churches and regularly brings together 60-80 young adults who are looking for community and connection to Christ.

Grad and Beyond

Grad and Beyond (G&B) is another major part of our ministry and it includes over 60 grad students and young professionals from the Kingston area. G&B is run in partnership with Bay Park and Bethel churches and members are part of 3 lifegroups, the Well, Huddles, and Houses.

Sunday Socials

Sunday Socials are community building events every weekend at Geneva House in Kingston where students come to have fun and build relationships. They are a great place for students to make friends and to bring their non-Christian friends to a space where they can experience how fun and amazing Christian community can be.

Restored

Restored is a healing and discipleship ministry for students who are struggling with pornography addictions, and other sexual strongholds. This semester we ran 2 groups for women and 1 group for men, and 15 people journeyed together to find hope, healing, and freedom.

Discover Christianity

Every Friday our international ministry team gathers students from all over the world to watch and discuss episodes of The Chosen. This resource has been an incredible way to introduce people to Jesus, His story and His significance.

Mentoring/1-1 Discipleship/Counseling

We invest deeply in the next generation. Our staff spend a lot of our time caring for and shepherding young adults through all sorts of challenges and experiences. It is where we feel like we really make a difference. Seeing God transform lives brings us so much joy and gives us so much hope for the future.

Leadership

We have over 60 leaders on 5 campuses serving as team members, team leaders, student interns, staff interns, and staff. They are an incredible group of students, young professionals, and a few slightly older folk who are so gifted, and so passionate about God's mission.

Campus Highlights

Queen's University

If I had to choose one word to describe our ministry at Queen's this semester it would be **transformation**. We really saw God moving on Queen's campus this semester - students were growing so much in Christ and in community. We definitely had the sense that God was doing something big and we were caught up in an exciting movement of the Spirit. People were choosing to follow Jesus, asking to be baptized, going deep with God and each other in huddles, finding healing and freedom from hurts and addictions, inviting their Christian and non-Christian friends to experience caring Christian community, stepping into leadership roles and taking ownership of the ministry. So often a leader would come up to me and tell me they had a new idea for ministry and ask if we could try it. I don't think I said no once! It was an exciting season of innovation and transformation. We invested in so many students - both Canadian and Internationals, and I have never seen so many students grow so quickly! St Lawrence College (SLC)

The word that I think best describes what is going on at SLC is **favour**. The blessing we are experiencing at this school can only come from God, and we are constantly amazed at how the administration values our presence and our investment in students and staff. The favour we experience with SLC is like nothing I have ever seen when working with public institutions. They love the work we have done with huddles and in particular the supportive community it offers. For many, this is the only support like this that they have. So the school has tasked SLC ministry lead Kathy to use this model and to create both faith based and non-faith based huddles for students and staff. Huddles are rippling through SLC and we are excited to have the freedom to invite the whole campus to grow in their faith or to begin to explore it.

Another really exciting part of our SLC ministry is the expansion of our Brockville site. Our on campus presence in Brockville is starting to have an impact, and team leader Michelle is making new connections with staff and students as she positions herself prominently every week in the cafeteria. Plus our team is growing! Jason Laroche, the pastor of the Pier church has joined our crew and is heading up church and community connections. He will be initiating a blessing ministry for the campus by local churches which we hope will include regular communal meals and other student supports.

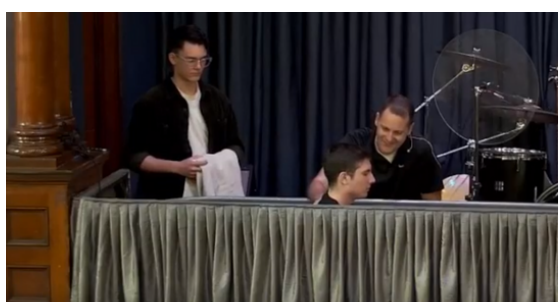


Loyalist College

My word for Loyalist is **breakthrough**. We have been working to establish a tangible presence at this school in Belleville for a number of years, but we have been struggling to make a connection with the administration and student government. Religious clubs are not permitted on campus, which is a policy that baffles many of us. Nevertheless, God has provided an amazing team of ministry leaders that show up on campus every week and they invest in and care for the incredible students that God brings to them. We have also partnered with Maranatha church to enfold students in a weekly young adults gathering, as well as monthly regional YA worship nights. So great things are happening in spite of our blockage with the school. A number of students have been powerfully impacted by this ministry, especially international students. Loyalist, like most other Canadian colleges, have about 40% of their population made up of out of country students, the largest percentage being from India. And this is where I get back to the word breakthrough. This semester, we decided to host an Easter dinner for Indian students. Our goal was to try to get the word out about our ministry to the campus, to create community and to share the Gospel message. And do you know what? We had a big breakthrough! 95 people came to our event, and about 75 were Indian students. We were blown away at the overwhelming response to this dinner, and we are sensing that our main focus moving forward might be with international students. This appears to be the opening that we were looking for and we are excited to see how God will lead us as we reach out to these students in the fall!



Royal Military College (RMC)



Before Covid, our ministry at RMC was really advancing and we had 3 huddles on campus. We were so excited to invest in these young military leaders, but when the pandemic hit, it led to a major ministry retreat at the school. All was quiet on the RMC front for a couple of years. However, this semester, reinforcements have arrived and God starting sending students from RMC to us! They were longing for Christian community and asking for help to establish a ministry presence on campus again. One student came to the Well one rainy night, and he was soaked from head to toe. He had walked all the way from RMC to our gathering at Bethel Church in a down pour, because he was so desperate for fellowship with other young adults who were followers of Jesus. Well, this past week he got even wetter when I had the privilege of baptizing him! A troop of RMC believers is forming and we are excited to see what God will do on this campus in the fall. That is why my word for RMC is **advance**.

Trent University

Welcome to Micah House!

Peterborough

Our goal is to create an intentional Christian community where people experience Jesus and his transformation. Our focus will be with students of Trent and Peterborough, we believe that God has a big plan for campus ministry here.

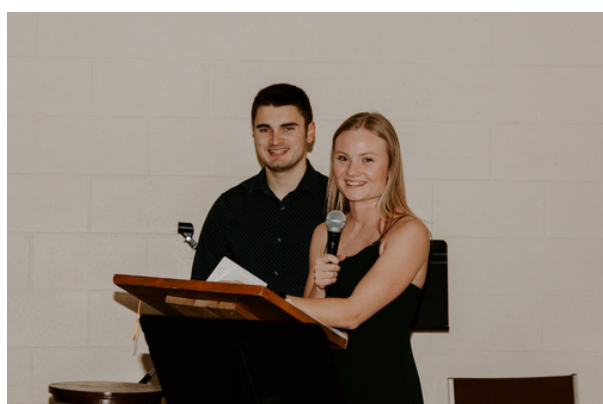


"What does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with our God."

There were many challenges working against the start of this ministry, but God kept telling Mike and his wife Judi to trust Him, and He kept providing bit by bit until Micah House was formed. Officially starting in September, this new missional home will be led by 2 fabulous young professionals and filled with 4 amazing Trent students.

Mike and Judi will pastor and mentor this new campus community and we are excited to continue to partner with Chaplain Ben Peltz and the Inter Varsity Christian Fellowship that meets on Trent campus, as well as local churches, with the hope of developing a network of missional homes for students in Peterborough.

What our young adults are saying...

How did God shape you this semester?

- I have grown in my faith in God, and have been working on an intimate relationship with Him. I have been trying to put God above everything else this semester. I hope that God will use me to pour into other people's lives, but I am still trying to work on myself before I can help others.
- I gained a better understanding of how deep God's love is for me, regardless of the circumstance.
- God has been changing my heart a lot recently. He has used difficult times this year to humble me and break me before him so that I can truly understand the depth of his love and his greatness. God has been pointing out parts of my heart that I haven't surrendered to him and areas in my life that I haven't entrusted to him. But all of that has led me to seek him more and to know him more, which has been the greatest gift. I have been starting to understand what it really means to lay down my own will and to accept the Father's will.
- He teaches me to trust that he is faithful and righteous. And learn to lift things and burdens up to him. Also, pray more and read his words more.
- I feel like I learned so much just from hearing about other's faith/life journeys, it was so cool to see Him working in so many ways.
- I felt like I learned so much from The Well Sessions, the hard part is remembering to apply what I learned to how I live.
- I learned a lot more about how to trust Him in a practical way, as well as sharing the Gospel with the Queen's community. I also realized how I can use powerful moments of my testimony to encourage my Christian friends around me when they're struggling. I grew a lot in worship ministry, as well as continually making the everyday choice to surrender and trust in Jesus.
- God taught me many things about trusting him, growing in my personal confidence, and not worrying so much about his plans for me. He also taught me about being patient and that sometimes, things happen when you are least expecting them to.
- God shaped me in a few ways this year. One was leadership, another was confidence, another was freedom, and finally faith! When it comes to leadership I often doubt or have low confidence in what I am capable of or if I can really make a difference. A continuous life lesson I've been learning is that it's not reliant on me, it is Christ within me. He has been transforming me by the renewing of my mind this year to go forth in what He's called me to do with no fear! I could never have imagined taking students under my wing and being someone they come to in crisis, for prayer, for someone to listen to them yet here I am thanks to God!
- God had been freeing me this year from things that the enemy tried to use to take me out. When Jesus said, "so if the son sets you free, you will be free indeed" I believe I see that more and more in my life as I actually believe it, trust in God for it, and live it out!
- Faith! This year was definitely a year where my faith was stretched! I am grateful God trusted me with the challenges that came my way to overcome them with His help and ultimately to bring me closer to Him!
- I was able to share bits of my testimony this year with some Geneva people and it was incredible to see what I believed wasn't that significant be a faith booster for someone else. God is so good, I'm telling y'all!

Restored was great for accountability and having a support system to share openly with. It was fun being a leader and being able to serve others through Huddle and worship at the Well.
- I am happy to meet new friends, learn English (words and communicating) through games or interesting activities.
- The Well: Small Groups - I learned so much from the small groups, they were so beneficial. I went to the Unhurry session in the fall, and the prayer/leadership sessions in the spring. I really liked the timing of the leadership session in particular as I'll be going to lead at a camp this summer. Kathy, Steve, Julia and Rachel did great leading their groups, two enthusiastic thumbs up!
- Very friendly, super fun social activities! I really enjoyed getting to be a part of such a fun community! I also really really enjoyed being disciplined by Julia - it was a really encouraging time to get together and share :)
- I loved the conversations, and the genuine nature of the people who attended. I met many new people in the community and I loved every minute of it. I'm extremely glad that The Well took place and that I was able to meet so many new people.
- Restored - It was awesome to have a group like restored for women as I believe that's often a taboo topic. I found there was a good community and I loved the group I was apart of. It was also cool to be asked by Julia to lead the group one time and to expand in my leadership capabilities! I believe this group should continue! :)
- The Well - Worship: It was awesome to see different worship leaders come forth and share this musical passion for the Lord.
- FIT Team: I think having a team that focuses on first years is so great!! When I was in first year it was difficult to know who to reach out to, until Julia Kooy found me and took me under her wing. Thanks Julia! I didn't officially join the FIT team until second semester, but there were still first years I had taken under my wing and was a familiar face for them all school year. First year can be a hard year, so having those one-on-one meet ups and keeping an eye out for them at events was great!

Geneva house has truly been a huge blessing in my life. Not only have I been encouraged in deepening my relationship with Christ, I have found a loving community. As a missional house resident, I have likeminded housemates who encourage me, challenge me, and have become my dearest friends. I am constantly surrounded by people who love the Lord and each other deeply. My huddle small group has been an amazing source of accountability and encouragement to spend more time with Christ, whether that be in reading, prayer, etc. We meet weekly to talk about what we have learned that week in our devotion times, to ask for accountability in specific areas, to discuss how we will serve others that week, and to pray for one another. Overall, I am so thankful for Geneva House, and I can't even imagine what my university experience would have been like without them.

Geneva house has been the hands and feet of Christ in so many ways in my life during university. This community has truly been a strong foundation for my faith. Being part of Sunday socials and the Well has given me more friendships than I could ever ask for. One of my favourite memories from university was walking down university avenue this year and not being able to make it ten steps without running into another friendly face from the Geneva community. My favourite part about Geneva though is how focused they are on developing young leaders in spiritual growth and missional living in huddles. Huddles have helped me to develop habits of getting into the Scripture, helped me to learn to hear God's voice and guidance on a daily basis, helped me to grow as a leader, and especially challenged me in living on mission for God in my daily life as a student. I am so thankful for the community God has blessed me with and can say without a doubt that God has been so faithful in working through Geneva house to change my life during university.

At the age of 10, I was exposed to pornography, exposed to things I shouldn't have seen at that age. Watching that, and not really understanding the distortion of love, my tendency to choose the flesh over God was reinforced. Shout out to Julia Kooy who runs Restored. I recommend it for anyone who struggles with pornography. The enemy used the lie that it was shameful, so I hid it for years. In John, Jesus said "you shall know the truth and the truth shall set you free". He is faithful and just to deliver us from the shackles of the enemy and I declare that Jesus is the Lord of my life. Nothing else can wash me, nothing else can fill me, nothing else can fulfill me but Jesus. Thank you to the body of Christ, so beautiful. Thank you to those who have poured into me from P2C, Geneva House and Bethel Church and to all the people who have contributed to my faith.
