Momentum Campus Ministries



As I write this report, Geneva House and Queen's campus is quiet. The spaces that are normally bustling with people and are full of laughter and exuberance, have turned to quiet, contemplative places where students are studying for exams or finishing assignments. A few students pass by my office window, soothing themselves with Starbucks in their hands and Spotify in their ears, trying to escape the chill of the December air and of their impending tests. But most have withdrawn to quiet libraries, or cozy coffee shops to focus on the tasks set before them. Times like this give me a great opportunity to pause and reflect on the past 15 weeks, the whirlwind we call a semester. In some ways September seems like so long ago. So much has happened since then. And at the same time, I can't believe the term is done. As I look back on this semester, two words come to mind - abundance and favour. This term God has blessed us with so much of both. In the almost 50 year history of our ministry, we have never had so many people and programs. In September we were caught off guard with how many people came to our first Well gathering. We had planned for 80, and more than 120 came. Huddles have continued to multiply and we now have 34 of these discipleship groups on our campuses. Add to that the over 80 leaders that are serving at our sites, and over 30 churches that are now partnering with us, I can't help but praise God for His incredible abundance. And along with this abundance has come God's generous favour. He has given us new levels of access, opportunities, partnerships, and supporters, all of which could only have happened because of His generous blessings. It has been an amazing semester and we are so thankful for your role in making this happen. Your partnership in our mission has made a huge difference in the lives of hundreds of young adults and we are so grateful for you and your help.

What follows in this report are pictures and stories and statistics and testimonies of what God has been doing on the campuses in Kingston, Belleville, Brockville, and Peterborough. A CLOSER LOOK AT SOME OF OUR PROGRAMS

Huddles

Huddles are a big part of how we work to fulfill our mission on campus. Huddles are discipleship groups of 5-6 people who are learning to follow Jesus, to listen to the Spirit, and to live out God's mission in their everyday lives. We see so much transformation through huddles and it is always so exciting to see young adults becoming passionate followers of Jesus. (https://www.genevahouse.ca/huddles)

The Well

The Well is our Kingston young adult worship and small group gathering every Wednesday night during the semester at Bethel Church. Our small groups are designed to reach both Christians and non-Christians and this semester they included: Face to Face with God - Experiencing His Presence, Building Relationships, Big Questions, Crazy Love, Facing Anxiety, Living Well with Overthinking and Rejection, and our International Fellowship Group.

Within the Veil

Within the Veil is a Quinte area young adult worship night held once a month during the school year. It is an amazing partnership of campus and local churches and regularly brings together 60-80 young adults who are looking for community and connection to Christ.

Grad and Beyond

Grad and Beyond (G&B) is another major part of our ministry and it includes over 40 grad students and young professionals from the Kingston area. G&B is run in partnership with Bay Park and Bethel churches and members are part of 3 lifegroups, the Well, huddles, and houses. (https://www.genevahouse.ca/grad-students)

Sunday Socials

Sunday Socials are community building events every weekend at Geneva House in Kingston where students come to have fun and build relationships. They are a great place for students to make friends and to bring their non-Christian friends to a space where they can experience how fun and amazing Christian community can be.

Restored

Restored is a healing and discipleship ministry for students who are struggling with pornography addictions, and other sexual strongholds. This semester 14 men journeyed together to find hope, healing, and freedom.

Discover Christianity

Every Friday our international ministry team gathers students online from all over the world to watch and discuss episodes of The Chosen. This resource has been an incredible way to introduce people to Jesus, His story and His significance.

Mentoring/1-1 Discipleship/Counselling

We invest deeply in the next generation. Our staff spend a lot of our time caring for and shepherding young adults through all sorts of challenges and experiences. It is where we feel like we really make a difference. Seeing God transform lives brings us so much joy and gives us so much hope for the future.

Leadership

We have over 80 leaders on 6 campuses serving as team members, team leaders, student interns, staff interns, and staff. They are an incredible group of students, young professionals, and a few slightly older folk who are so gifted, and so passionate about God's mission.

Campus Highlights

Queen's University

If a Gen Z were to describe our Queen's ministry, I think they would use the word "bussin". What exactly "bussin" means is hard to explain, but it can be translated as "extremely awesome" or maybe even "booming". However you define it, things were definitely "bussin" this semester, and God was doing so much. In September we connected with over a hundred new students, and we had more first years join our community than ever before. Many of them applied to live in missional houses next year and in fact so many students applied to live in next year's houses, that we had to find more houses to fill them. God willing, we will have 3 more houses on Queen's campus next year, and that will bring us to 7 in Kingston! Huddles also grew this semester. We had 17 at Queen's last year (including undergrads, grad students and young professionals) and this semester God blessed us with 25! As I mentioned earlier, our weekly worship and small group night called The Well, also grew a lot. Our high last year was 80, this year it was over 120. This term we had 14 men on a journey of freedom from pornography through the Restored program, and we hope to start more Restored groups in January for both women and men. Leading all these incredible ministry activities at Queen's are over 60 phenomenal leaders including 7 interns and 3 staff. We have such an amazing team, and I am so thankful for them!

I know I have thrown a lot of numbers at you, but I think the amazing thing is that each of these numbers represent a real person. They are actual students or young professionals who are being cared for deeply and being discipled in the ways of Jesus. Later on in this report, you can hear first hand from some of them about how they have been transformed this semester, and that is always my favourite part of this report. There is so much more I could tell you about how God is working on Queen's campus, but time and space constrain me. St Lawrence College (SLC)

SLC has 3 campuses - Kingston (4000+ students), Brockville (700), and Cornwall (1000). Overseeing all of SLC's spiritual care is Kathy Doering who functions as a multi-faith chaplain. Kathy spends a lot of time counselling students and coordinating a spiritual support system she designed called Thrive. Our Momentum team helps her lead the Christian part of her portfolio - Ashlesha Gaur heads up the ministry team in Kingston and Jason DeRoche is the team lead in Brockville. We are still in search of a team lead for Cornwall and if you know of anyone who would be great please let us know! There is a great opportunity for ministry there.

Kingston Ministry has been going amazing. In addition to 13 support groups based on our huddle model, we offer 6 Christian huddles, 1-1 discipleship, the Well, and social events. There is a real mix of domestic and international students who are involved in our ministry, and our SLC Kingston leadership team is made up of mostly international students. On December 15 this crew hosted an amazing Christmas outreach event in partnership with Kingston International Students, and around 40 international students came out for a community building meal and an introduction to what Christmas is all about.











Our Brockville ministry is really starting to gain momentum and we are making some great connections on campus. Our team is growing, even though we did have to say goodbye to team leader Michelle Poelman who stepped away to work at Life + Hope Wellness counselling practice. Michelle was foundational to starting our ministry at SLC Brockville and has helped build our presence on campus and our partnerships in the city. We are so grateful for her work and wish her all the best in her new ministry!





Thankfully, God has provided an amazing new team leader in Jason DeRoche (Lead Pastor of The Pier Church). Jason has been on our local ministry team for the past year and he is excited to take on this new role. He has a heart to bless the campus and has been developing initiatives to care for both domestic and international students in Brockville. He is helping lead a weekly student support group on campus and is working on building a ministry team from local churches. Exciting new connections are being made and we are excited to see how God is going to build this ministry!

Loyalist College

Our Loyalist ministry continues to grow in scope and especially in the area of international ministry. International students are an important part of every part of our campus community including our weekly huddle, our leadership team, and our outreach events. On November 28 we partnered with Maranatha Church's young adults ministry, and some other amazing local churches to host an outreach Christmas dinner for international students, and 2 exciting things happened. First, the college allowed us to advertise - that is a really big deal because the school is very cautious and closed to promoting Christian events. And secondly over 130 people came! It was an incredible evening of meeting new students and sharing about Christmas and the love of Jesus. We have also partnered together with an organization called Friends for Dinner, which matches international students with host families for meals. It is an amazing program which provides care for and connections with students. Working with local churches, we have 40 students matched up with 17 hosts!

We really care for international students, and they need it, because they are a very vulnerable segment of the college, and they are often taken advantage of. Last year, we noticed that one of our students from India was really struggling. He was losing weight and struggling with depression, and it turns out that he had a very poor living arrangement. He was one of 10 Indian students packed into a house and he didn't even have a proper room. Our team leader Wanda worked with him to get him out of these substandard conditions and into a healthier situation and now he is thriving. He is doing much better physically, mentally, and spiritually. He attends our weekly huddle and has even stepped into leadership. His life has really been transformed, and we are so grateful that God has sent him and so many other international students into our community. It is a gift to be part of their journey.















Royal Military College (RMC)



Our ministry to RMC is marching forward and we are so "tankful" for team leader Brian "Phineas" Gauchier. Phineas has done an amazing job of developing a ministry presence at RMC, and connecting military students to Momentum. He has a gift of inviting others out and plugging them into our community and our programs like the Well, Sunday Socials, and our big events. He also does an outstanding job of helping students find local churches. He regularly takes them on Sunday morning reconnaissance tours to help them find a church that they connect with. Next semester we have hopes to bring back huddles to the RMC campus, and we are excited to see where God will lead us!







Trent University

Our ministry in Peterborough is headed up by team leader Mike Broersma (pastor of outreach and worship at Living Hope Church). Mike and his wife Judi have developed a missional house where 5 incredible young adults live in intentional Christian community. Made up of 2 young professionals and 3 Trent students, the residents have been investing in each other through a discipleship huddle and finding creative ways to reach out to others in their neighbourhood and on campus with God's love. Local church members have been blessing them by bringing over meals and having dinner with them, and a really amazing community is forming.



Mike is also organizing prayer drive bys and prayer walks on campus and we are partnering with Trent's InterVarsity's group and Chaplain Ben Peltz to reach out to students on campus. Our ministry in Peterborough is really starting to take off and we appreciate all the church and ministry partners who are helping us build God's mission here!







What our young adults are saying...

How did our campus ministry help you this semester?

- Geneva has helped me to see first hand the original purpose of the church. It is cool to see the body of Christ at work through so many of the groups that are part of the campus ministry. What went well with the groups you were involved in this semester?

- I feel so blessed and happy to my living in my missional house. Having only lived with non Christians before, I deeply cherished the sense of community and belonging that living in the missional house has brought me. I feel I have definitely grown in my faith and I love hearing how God is working in my housemates lives as well. This has been an experience that I will never forget and only wish I had moved into a missional house sooner!
- I have loved living at a missional house this year!! Being a part of a huddle as a house has really brought us closer together and was always a highlight of my week. I really appreciated everyone's vulnerability and the opportunity we had to see God working in each other's lives throughout the semester.
- Huddle as a Ministry House went well as it was a quality time of bonding as a house and growing in our faith together. (One resident) would call it, "family time". I think it has been one of the points of our success as a house where we intentionally look out for each other and pray for each other and be vulnerable with each other. - I really loved huddle & mentoring and appreciated being encouraged and challenged and being able to meet new friends

- Weekly we had a meeting to go through the book that we got for huddle group. The atmosphere was really nice, and everyone tried to build each other up, so it was very encouraging.
- I was part of the online Huddle. It was such a great way for everyone who was away this year to stay connected to the community! How did God shape you this year?

- This year I can definitely say I have grown as a Christian in many ways. Firstly, by living with fellow believers I was reminded of the importance of fellowship and community. Having a group of Christian friends who share the same values as you and who help to hold you accountable has greatly contributed to my personal walk with God. Joining this missional house has been an answer to prayer and since living here I have been reminded of the power of prayer. Surrendering different anxieties to God has continuously been something my housemates and I have been working on, and it's been amazing to see all of us make progress in this area in different ways.
- God showed me the beauty of TEAM and how diversity is such a blessing in the body of Christ. There are so many different gifts, talents and strengths and it's really cool when we lean on others to exercise those gifts and talents and then lead in them with boldness. God is growing me to continually seek first His Kingdom knowing that ALL the other things will be added to me and those around me I serve with!
- This year, especially 2023 has been such a pivotal year for me in my relationship with Christ. Going into my third year was a new beginning as I wasn't playing basketball, and God has taught me to see life with eyes of faith instead of sight. He has taught me to develop my relationships and friendships that I have. He has grown me and my passions and my gifts. He taught me that He is a God that redeems situations and people like me.
- God has definitely been teaching me that He is bigger than the mountains I or people close to me may face! I have also once again been taught the importance of Christian community and love being able to come home to a community like Geneva House. I believe God has been growing me in the area of stepping back and letting Him come forth through whatever ways He wants to use me. God doesn't really need us, but He created us, loves us and made a plan for us which is so special!
- This year I learned, or better understood, that God is the creator of the universe and he loves me and has a plan for me. I learned that I should not be afraid of the future because God has it all sorted out for me already. I found ways to worship God in all that I do and I want to continue this! I also learned the community helps you grow. I feel like God has called me to invest in my Christian community more so that I can grow in a closer relationship with him.
- This was a big year for trusting God! God continually taught me that He is not just a good God but a loving father. Even as we choose to do things our own way He is still faithful to His promises and covenants. Yes, for all humanity and eternity, but also personally and lovingly.
- God has helped me to grow so much this semester! I was able to share my testimony at the Well, with the help of the Holy Spirit. I also developed as a worship leader through leading more songs and in my prayer life (I've loved the prayer team!) My personal Bible reading time has grown in depth too! So so grateful for Geneva:)
- God provided for me through meeting with Julia! Really needed support aside from friendships in order to receive it better. God taught me that he will provide even when I don't see it, that I need to have open eyes to see the unexpected goodness when the things I expect might not be happening.
- God taught me to involve myself in my community as much as I can.
- I'm really taking my time to understand God's word and how he worked through me through the week, and what I can do for God in the upcoming week.
- This semester, mostly realizing I need to trust and rely on God, and not myself. And that when I think I'm too busy, those are the days I need to start with prayer. Giving God time (in devos) isn't about finding a time you can't use elsewhere, it's about trusting Him with time you could use elsewhere.
- Grew in wisdom and knowledge
- Learning He puts us in places for a reason even if it's not easy.
- I feel I grew and was challenged in the area of humility/dependance on God.
- This year God has been teaching me to fully surrender my school work to Him and to seek rest in Him.
- God has been so good this year. The redemption and the grace I have experienced are remarkable. He taught me to be more bold with my faith. God brought me to Kingston and to Queen's for a reason and I'm so excited to continue to see what He has planned for me.
- God has been working abundantly in my life this year. I have had some exciting but also scary things happen in my life that God lead me through and protected me. I am so blessed to have Jesus on my life journey!
- God challenged me to be in His word daily, I am learning so much from reading my Bible and prioritizing quiet time with Him.







Testimonies

Here are some testimonies about how God has been working in some students' lives:

In 2023, my entire year has been transformational for my walk with Christ. Reflecting on this semester, my relationship with Jesus has grown, and I have learned so much. God first worked in me before working through me. Heading into my second year, I applied to live in a missional house, knowing I wanted to reside with Christians and like-minded people. I was nervous to move in this year as it would be a big change, but God removed those nerves in the first week I moved into Geneva. The girls were not just my housemates but my sisters in Christ. I've shared tears, laughter, and so many things with them. I've grown so much as a friend, person, and Christ follower by being in this environment.

Since my first year, I have been in a huddle that has continuously pushed me in my faith, helped me stay accountable in my Bible readings, and provided a space to be vulnerable. I believe a significant lesson for me to learn from my past mistakes was to confess and be vulnerable with women I trusted. I wanted to create space for women to do the same, so I applied to be a Bible study leader and hosted weekly Thursday Bible studies, co-leading with my friend. I saw myself grow in leadership, consistency in the word, and vulnerability. The small group is only as vulnerable as the leaders make it. I also learned to trust God and have high expectations for what he had in store for this Bible study. I saw women's lives changed and a new boldness in their faith. I stepped into more mentorship opportunities this year and continued to pour into the lives of young women over coffee. I've taken first-years under my wings, but I always held on to the fact that I was under God's wings. I've had students reach out to me for Bibles, and Geneva has been such a blessing in helping me find the right one for them as they grow in their walk. I've also seen God revealing to me gifts that he's instilled in me: public speaking, writing poetry, and community building. I've had so many God-given opportunities to public speak and share my testimony. I was blessed with the opportunity to MC at Pursuit a couple of months ago, a Christian young adults conference. God has also opened doors at our weekly worship and small group event to share my testimony, MC, and share verses. My personal faith journey with God has been a journey full of blessings, lessons, and struggles. I'm excited for what is in store for 2024, and I'm all in for God's plan.













Testimonies

Here are some testimonties about how God has been working in some students' lives:

I had always called myself a "Christian," but if you looked closely at my life you would find that I chose to live in a way that did not truly honour Jesus - some would call me "lukewarm." I finally came to the point of making a choice this past year when I found myself in a dark and scary place after experiencing a devastating heartbreak: I could keep living "half-in, half-out," or I could finally choose Jesus, for real this time. While God allowed my heart to break a little, it opened up just enough in the process of breaking, for him to fill me with his spirit and completely transform my life. This was the moment when I finally began living for Jesus, but there were still challenges ahead of me even after embracing a new life. I was entering my fourth year at Queen's with a desire to change my lifestyle, after living in the university's partying and drinking culture for the last three years.

Now that I had been truly reborn, I had to leave the past behind, and it was scary. During the summer before my fourth year, I ran to God in prayer and asked him to replace my old friendships and community with new ones, that would bring him the glory and help support me on my new walk in faith. It was only a few short weeks before school started that I began to look into what some of the on-campus ministries had to offer. I had felt so much fear about reaching out and trying to rebuild a whole new life for myself at Queen's in my final year. So with a bit of hesitancy, I took a chance after emailing and sharing my story with one of the Momentum Campus Ministry Leaders, Julia Kooy. I didn't know what to expect, but I had trusted God this far, and I knew he wouldn't let me down.

Through just the first week of orientation events, I found myself in complete awe of how loving and inclusive the community at Geneva House was. In that week, I had already made so many new friends, who cared deeply about me and brought me closer to Jesus. Living in this answered prayer that God delivered to me through Geneva House has completely transformed what my life once looked like at Queen's. As I left my past behind and ventured into new territory and community, I was so relieved to be reminded once again that God keeps his promises, when we choose to trust him and follow his lead. Ever since, I have been an active member within the community, and have even had the chance to unlock the gift of worship that God placed inside me, as I took on the role of being a weekly worship leader at "The Well."

As I set sail this year into the kind of life God had always pre-destined for me, it was scary to be in the middle of the ocean for a while, not knowing where I would go next. Luckily, Jesus, my captain knew where he was taking me, and Geneva was my "promised land."
